



Collier Township Emergency Management Coaches LZ Handout 2021

Parking lots and sports surfaces at Collier Township Parks may be used as an **Emergency Landing Zone**. When Emergency Personnel arrive, they will instruct coaches, players, and spectators to a designated staging area. It is vital that all coaches, players, and spectators stay in the designated staging area until they receive an “**all clear**” notification from Emergency Personnel. It is also recommended that all tents, chairs, and loose items be secured. **Do Not** look in the direction of the helicopter during landing and take off as blowing debris can cause injury. Always keep at least 200 feet of distance between coaches, players and spectators and the helicopter.

DO NOT APPROACH THE HELICOPTER unless escorted by the pilot or crew members.

IF ON UNEVEN GROUND, approach or depart from the downhill side for maximum rotor clearance. **DO NOT RAISE ANYTHING ABOVE THE HEAD** and crouch while walking in the vicinity of the helicopter.

BEWARE OF ROTOR DOWNWASH

PROTECT EYES with safety goggles or turn head when helicopter is landing and departing.

SPECTATORS must remain 200 feet clear of the helicopter. **EMERGENCY VEHICLES** must remain 150 feet away until instructed by the pilot or crew members. **NO VEHICLES OR PERSONNEL** are allowed within the landing zone during landing and take-off.
